Dr. Bubacco, deputy chairman of the Department of Biology at the University of Padova. In 1989, he received a Bachelor's degree in biology from the University of Padova, and in 1995, he received a Master's degree and doctorate in biophysics from Albert Einstein College of Medicine. He then moved, as postdoc, to the University of Leiden to work on a structural biology of metalloproteins. Since 1998 he has been in Padova first as researcher and then as professor of molecular physiology. Currently the main focus of his laboratory is the investigation of the molecular mechanism of neurodegeneration in Parkinson's disease.

He trained as a geophysical engineer and has been working in the field of pollution control for over 25 years. he chairs the supervisory board of the Valgo group, an international specialist in soil and groundwater remediation with a dynamic subsidiary, Valgo Italia. He was also elected President of the French Union of Site Remediation Professionals (UPDS) for two consecutive terms. Today, he manages a start-up incubated by Valgo called SPUMA (spuma meaning foam in Latin), dedicated to the treatment of PFAS, eternal pollutants.

Alberto Toso Fei

The narrator of Venice

Alberto Toso Fei is descended from an ancient family of Murano glassmakers. He is a journalist, writer and essayist translated into several languages. His books on the secret and legendary history of Venice, born from the recovery of oral tradition, have become theatrical performances, works of art, and installations. Like a living time machine, with his storytelling, he gives life to recitals, lecture-shows, TEDx, initiatives, online and social events. In recent years he has focused his attention on the city's historical graffiti, collected and studied together with historian Desi Marangon as a corpus for the first time. A protagonist of cultural life in Venice, he is a point of reference for its history. Alberto Toso Fei is the narrator of Venice.

Simone Venturini is a young political leader with long experience in public administration and management of complex organizations. Gunter Pauli (1956) is an entrepreneur who has pioneered innovative business models throughout his professional career. In the 1980s, during a major economic crisis, he led a think tank to identify highgrowth service companies in Europe. In the 1990s, he created a think tank to prepare for the Kyoto Protocol after building and operating the first green factory that applied the zero emissions concept. He has advised governments, entrepreneurs and business leaders on how to implement breakthrough innovations that enable society to better meet the basic needs of all, starting with water, food, shelter, health and energy. He works with what is locally available and focuses on creating value. In the 21st century, Gunter set out to accelerate the solutions he describéd in his landmark book «The Blue Economy,» a Club of Rome report translated into more than 50 languages. He has published 23 books, which have been printed in 46 languages and 365 fables bringing a learning of the science and emotions to children.
